

UNITh: 250 m<sup>2</sup> for art involving new technologies

January 17 - April 15, 1993. Projektraum Wien, WUK

Unit<sup>n</sup> is a space to present and discuss or to translate works into reality.

The series of events i.a. includes symposia, presentations, performances, lectures, an exhibition, a concert, the project pool and a temporary video library.

During a period of three months 120 artists, groups, critics, curators and politicians from Austria and abroad will meet to discuss art involving new technologies, with the main focus being placed on digital technologies. Artistic, technological, organisational, economic and social dimensions will be the subject matters to be dealt with in this context.

The entire event creates a network of links and information lines which transcend the architectural space, reaching various artists and research institutions around the world.

15 projects designed by 11 groups and a number of individuals provide the framework; the projects will be prepared, organised, implemented, presented or discussed in Unit<sup>n</sup>.

Various groups and the company COMPAQ have made available 7 computer workstations and infrastructure which can be used by the participants.

COMPAQ Computers and RADIO AUSTRIA AG support the event as main sponsors.

We have reached the end of an era of "re-programming". Social and cultural positions between existing and future technologies are still to be defined/re-determined. In view of the growing amount and great speed involved in the flow of information the question is raised what these units of information represent, what they mean. Although new technologies tend to be a male domain, a recent study has revealed that the share of female artists active in this field has already reached one third.

In the framework of a two-day symposium a number of representatives of this one third will hold media discussions under the title "Let's talk about media" at the project space Unit<sup>n</sup>.

The project is to be continued in an international symposium in autumn.
